Scholarship opportunities for graduating seniors

Time is running out for students to pick up an application for the following scholarships. The deadline to get these scholarships in is Monday, May 7th at NOON.

Catherine Millerbernd Memorial Scholarship- One \$500 award available to a graduating senior.

Knights of Columbus Scholarship- One \$500 (\$700 if attending a Catholic institution) award available to a graduating senior.

Lions Club Scholarship- Two \$250 awards available to graduating seniors.

KOPP Family Foundation Scholarship- Awarded to graduating seniors with a cumulative G.P.A or 3.0 or higher who will be attending an accredited two or four year college, university, vocational or technical school.

American Red Cross Scholarship- One \$250 award available to a graduating senior.

Angermeyr Band Scholarship- Available to a student entering grades 9-12 next year who is active in band.
