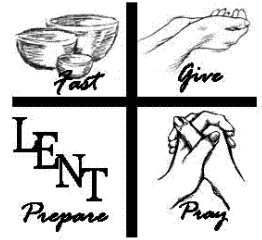

**TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR THE 2019-2020
SCHOOL YEAR**

Families interested in receiving tuition assistance must submit a tuition assistance application to TADS, the service utilized by many Diocesan schools. Applications submitted by April 1 will be given priority consideration. Requests for tuition assistance may be made after the priority deadline. All applicants must be enrolled for the next school year prior to submitting the TADS application. You can apply online by going to www.mytads.com. You will be guided through the application. Please be aware that you will need your tax returns to file the application. A paper worksheet is available from the high school office if you would like this to assist you in filling out the form before you go online. You may request a paper application by calling 1-800-884-8237 or going to www.tads.com/paperform. A fee of \$34 is required when applying. If your application is received before April you will receive your award letter before the end of the current school year. If applications are received after April 1 recipients will be notified by mail before the school year begins.

Families who qualify for tuition assistance through the TADS process receive funding through the Holy Trinity Educational Trust Fund. Holy Trinity parish members, alumni, and friends make this opportunity a possibility by donating to the trust fund. Tuition assistance is available for all Holy Trinity families. Students who receive Tuition Assistance from Holy Trinity are expected to maintain passing grades, participate in all school fundraising drives and give service to the school.
